DIRECTOR'S NOTE:

I first saw *Night of the Living Dead* when I was seven years old. I was, perhaps unsurprisingly, completely traumatized, and spent the next 3 years calculating how far I was from the nearest graveyard (San Diego seemed pretty safe - I didn't even know where a cemetery was; my grandmother's house in small-town Wisconsin was the highest risk - there was a cemetery within a mile, and I KNEW that the undead were coming for me). I believe I saw *Twelfth Night* for the first time around the same period, but as it didn't traumatize me, the date is less fixed in my mind - I just remember desperately wanting to one day be able to be a part of that world. I didn't rewatch *Night of the Living Dead* until I was in my 20s, sparking a zombie fascination that is only rivaled by my theatre-kid adoration of Shakespeare. When Amanda brought this script to me, I knew it was everything I had ever wanted - but would Loud Fridge think it a good fit for our upcoming season?

The answer was a resounding yes. The board loved the script, not only because it's hilarious, but because it gave us the opportunity to fulfill a desire to produce classical work while still holding true to who we are as a company. Twelfth Night of the Living Dead welcomes all to the theatre - those who love Shakespeare, those who love zombies, and those who want to see how those two worlds can possibly intersect. In partnering with the City Heights Performance Annex, we are thrilled to be able to offer tickets to this production free of charge, expanding our Open Fridge policy of removing ticket price as a barrier to entry for theatre goers. Furthermore, Twelfth Night of the Living Dead has allowed us create a truly progressive, intersectional theatrical

experience, incorporating dance, fight, drag, live music, and classical text into a show that highlights the incredible talent in San Diego, from our playwright, to our design and directorial team, to our remarkable cast of local performers. We hope you'll agree that this is truly theatre like you've never seen it before.



Notes From the Playwright:

Many among the Living have wondered where the idea came from for Twelfth Night of the Living Dead (or What You Kill). The answer is, it came as a vision. You see, there is another script called 'TNotLD' (no subtitle). A friend took me to see it performed in 2007, and I was dying laughing. It wasn't until years later when I bought a copy (because I still thought it was so funny), that I realized I must have spent the whole time I was sitting in the audience watching my own imagination! While still very funny, what I saw then is quite different from what you're about to see. What makes this version (our version) totally unique from the other, is that ours only uses Shakespeare's language (no 'devised' language involving green-glowing meteorites). This creature-feature script has always "lived" inside Shakespeare's masterful script. Many thanks are due to Richard Baird (my partner in love and art) for "ordering the deaths"; to Gideon Rappaport for lending his dramaturgical eye to this cut (massacre) of Shakespeare's original text; to New Fortune Theatre for (hilariously) workshopping the drafts; and of course, my hat (and head) is off to Kate Rose Reynolds and LOUD FRIDGE for bringing this world-premiere Creation to Life!






HAYDEN ST CLAIR (Sebastian)

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
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


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
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
